Policies & Programs Needed to Ensure PrEP Access Nationwide

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Why Uptake Hasn't Been Better

- Should not be the cost of the drug
 - Low-cost generics & available for free
- Insufficient federal government outreach program to community & providers
- No payer for lab services for the uninsured
- CDC just beginning to allow state grantees to pay for PrEP services
 - Limited level & not for the Rx
 - Has been available for EHE grants (not Rx)
 - Need grantee accountability



Why Uptake Hasn't Been Better

- Zero cost sharing for private insurance recently went into effect
 - ► Federal Government slow to issue guidance
 - Insurers aren't in compliance
 - People still being charged
- Daily pill w/ follow-up visits (up until now)
- Stigma



What Can be Done to Scale Up PrEP

- National PrEP Grant Program
 - To meet current and future needs
- CDC Must allow grantees to Spend more on PrEP
- Continued Community Health Center Funding
 - ▶ \$102 million to 271 Centers
 - Must expand to all 1,400
 - ▶ 389,000 PrEP Patients at 925 Centers
 - Need better data



Private Insurance

- Current Requirements Must be Enforced
 - Drug Formularies Checked
 - Improved Transparency for Prevention Drugs
 - State Insurance Commissioner's must take action
- New Drugs Quickly Reviewed by USPSTF
 - CCIIO Guidance Updated
 - Continued Enforcement



Medicaid & Medicare

- State Medicaid Programs cover PrEP & labs
 - Very low cost-sharing, if any
 - But many states not expanded Medicaid to all low-income individuals
- PrEP Covered under Medicare Part D
 - All ARV's must be covered
 - Beneficiary cost-sharing applies



National PrEP Grant Program Legislation

- PrEP Assistance Program Act (<u>HR 5605</u>)
- Rep. Bonnie Watson Coleman (D-NJ)
- Establishes \$400 million/year for:
 - Community & Provider Outreach
 - PrEP & associated services for uninsured & underinsured
- Eligible entities:
 - States, tribes, cities, FQHCs, family planning centers, rural health clinics, CBOs, Ryan White Program Clinics



National PrEP Grant Program Legislation

- ► PrEP Access and Coverage Act (S 3295, HR 6117)
- Sen. Tina Smith (D-MN) & Rep. Adam Schiff (D-CA)
- Establishes Separate Grant Programs for Community & Provider Outreach
 - No specified dollar amount
- PrEP & associated services for uninsured & underinsured
- Same list of eligible entities



PrEP Access and Coverage Act: Additional Components

- No cost-sharing for all PrEP Rx's & associated services by all payers (Private Insurance, Medicare, Medicaid, Indian Health, TriCare)
 - No prior authorizations
- No discrimination in disability, long-term care, life insurance for PrEP users
- Education campaign by HHS Secretary
- Protects privacy of PrEP users on family plan



Appropriations

- Whatever is authorized still must be funded
- Can establish grant program through appropriations, especially if build on existing programs
- ► 111 HIV & LGBTQ orgs. sent letter to President Biden in support of \$400 million national PrEP grant program in FY23 budget



Letter to President Biden

- Build on existing CDC & FQHC programs
- Utilize, as appropriate
 - Existing payers
 - No cost-sharing for private insurance
 - Generic drugs
 - Free Rx programs
 - ▶ 340B program
- ▶ If created under "STD Clinic/Section 318" authority any grantee, including Ryan White Program clinics, can use 340B and pay for & conduct PrEP activities
